





The Logistics Institute – Asia Pacific (TLI-AP), National University of Singapore (NUS), and the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre), and other Partner Agencies in Southeast Asia, will be organizing an online training programme in Disaster Management, supported by **Temasek Foundation**.

In the aftermath of major calamities, the mission to reduce human suffering and save lives is hindered by many challenges. There is a strong need to provide the impetus in connecting stakeholders and enhancing collaboration in developing technology-enabled humanitarian logistics and supply chain management. The use of smart network technology including AI, Machine Learning, blockchains etc. will increase visibility and transparency, leverage existing ecosystems to securely transact over/under-utilised resources, lower investments, create scale efficiency, optimise industry-wide resources, consolidate demand and supply, lower digital investments, and create greater market reach and sustainability.

This programme will enable 120 specialists from AHA Centre and other programme partners in Southeast Asia including National Disaster Management Offices (NDMOs), NGOs, Logistics Service Providers (LSPs), Suppliers, other Government Ministries/Agencies, State-owned Enterprises, public universities etc. to participate in a series of online training workshops that may include the following modules:

- Supply Chain Thinking and Digital Practice/Learning by Serious Gaming;
- Control Towers: Visualization, Supply Chain Analytics and Performance Dashboarding;
- Demand Sensing and Data Analysis;
- Digital Twins: Analytics, Optimization and Simulation;
- Capacity and Services Coordination;

- Advanced technologies in Supply Chain Management: Supply Chain Risk, Block Chains, Quantum Computing, and Artificial Intelligence/Machine Learning;
- Supplier Quality and Inventory Assurance;
- Consolidation of Requirements, Technology Enablement, and Case-based Validation of a Blueprint/Proof of Concept;
- Review and Confirmation of a Blueprint/Proof of Concept for a Digital Dashboard for Disaster Management

The official programme launch is planned to take place on 21st June 2021 and will be attended by His Excellency Susiwijono Moegiarso, Deputy Coordinating Minister for Commerce and Industry, Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs Indonesia, Mr. Benedict Cheong, Chief Executive of Temasek Foundation International, Ms. Adelina Kamal, Executive Director of AHA Centre, Dr. Robert De Souza, Executive Director of TLI-AP NUS, and senior leaders of other programme partners.
