The Logistics Institute – Asia Pacific (TLI-AP), National University of Singapore (NUS), and the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs Indonesia (CMEA), supported by Temasek Foundation (TF), will soon embark on a Digital Urban Logistics Programme that will enhance capabilities in digital supply chain management thinking and practice.

The COVID-19 pandemic which has been prolonged and drawn out has been a strong catalyst and impetus in exposing the critical need for business and commerce to further digitalise and explore usage of new technologies. Digitalisation plays a crucial role in the processing and coordination of operations and orders in a timely, targeted, and expeditious manner.

This programme will enable 160 leaders and specialists from CMEA and programme partners in Indonesia and Thailand including Government Ministries/Agencies, Stateowned Enterprises, public universities etc. to participate in a series of online training workshops that may include the following modules:

- Supply Chain Thinking and Digital Practice/Learning by Serious Gaming;
- Control Towers: Visualization, Supply Chain Analytics and Performance Dashboarding;
- Digital Twins: Analytics, Optimization and Simulation; and
- Advanced technologies in Supply Chain Management: Supply Chain Risk, Block Chains, Quantum Computing, and Artificial Intelligence/Machine Learning.

The official programme launch is planned to take place on 21st June 2021 and will be attended by His Excellency Susiwijono Moegiarso, Deputy Coordinating Minister for Commerce and Industry, Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs Indonesia, Mr. Benedict Cheong, Chief Executive of Temasek Foundation International, Dr. Robert De Souza, Executive Director of TLI-AP NUS, and senior leaders of other partner organisations.
